

Vestry approves purchase of AED



Sudden cardiac arrest is one of the leading causes of death in the U.S. Over 350,000 people will suffer from sudden cardiac arrest this year. It can happen to anyone, anytime, anywhere and at any age. An AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) is the only effective treatment for restoring a regular heart rhythm during sudden cardiac arrest and is an easy to operate tool for someone with no medical background.

Time is of the essence. For each minute defibrillation is delayed, the chance of survival is reduced approximately 10%.

In mid-December, there was a medical emergency at St. John's, during a Sunday worship service. The emergency medical personnel from the Naples fire station at 26th Avenue N. and U.S. 41 took 12 minutes to arrive on scene. Fortunately, the person was not having a heart attack.

Dick Clapp, a Vestry member, had his life saved 30 years ago, by an AED accompanied by cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

Recently, Dick made a recommendation to the Vestry, based on research he had done, to purchase an AED and to organize training programs. The Vestry approved and an AED will be purchased and mounted on the wall in the hallway to the left of the altar (as one faces the altar).

Training of key St. John's members and staff will take place in April. Following this step, the availability of this life saver will be announced to the congregation. □


