





## Treadwell gives Aleppo update and presents parish with a special print

We had the pleasure of another visit from Jamie Treadwell, artist and Urban Monk, who recently spoke at the weekend services, updating us on the Christian community status in Aleppo, Syria.

He said one can only understand the brothers and sisters in Aleppo if you can understand the power and joy of the Gospel. Their reason for staying in that situation is to witness to the love of Christ.

Knowing that they are not alone brings them encouragement. Not just because they have a bit more food than usual, or are able to get some medicine to treat a child's illness, but because they are now able to reach out to those around them even more.

They know that their witness is also your witness. You understand them and are not saying to them "Run and hide, be safe, forget those people and the power of the Resurrection." Rather you say, "you are our brothers and sisters. Thank you for extending a hand of love for us as well. You give us courage. You quicken our faith. You have opened the eyes of our hearts. Thank you; we're in this together!"

He also presented St. John's with one of his special edition prints of "In This Together," in recognition of our support of Syrian Christians, which began in May of this year. □

# Wear a statement of support

Our parish is kept aware of the

persecutions of Christians throughout the Middle East and Africa through the ministry of Jamie Treadwell and, since May, we are contributing significant financial assistance to the Christian community in Allepo, the capitol city of Syria.

Until recently, Christians in our country have done little to publicly demonstrate our solidarity with these persecuted believers. But now, there is a concrete, specific and public way, for us as individual believers to exhibit our support for these victims.

It is a one-inch square pin bearing the Arabic letter "N" and an inscription, "I too am a Nazarene."
Terrorists mark Christian homes with the Arabic letter "N" to identify the households as "Nazarenes" or followers of Jesus Christ. This "N" marks them for death.

The pins, which cost \$5, are a project of St. Katherine's Greek Orthodox Church in North Naples. Proceeds go to The International Orthodox Christian Charities, a global relief agency for Christian World Orthodoxy and provide basic needs, food, blankets to the needy, even Muslims not in standing with the terrorists.

Please pray that Aleppo would not fall into the wrong hands completely. The battle for Aleppo continues. Please pray insistently as this is a very tenuous situation and the fall of the city can have long-lasting effects on the ground for the whole country. Pray, too, that the Christians who feel the call to remain in in Aleppo would do so courageously and remain unharmed. They are needed there as witnesses to the truth of the Gospel of Jesus.

#### Here is an update on the situation on the ground:

- Kidnappings continued including 300 Christians at the hands of Islamic State. (March 2015)
- Al Nusra front still occupies large areas of Aleppo. They are surrounded by the Syrian Army who, in turn, are encircled by Islamic State. On June 15, 200 rockets fell that day on the western part of Aleppo, where Christians mostly live.
- One message was sent via WhatsApp: "Please pray, Aleppo is in great danger. Satan is using all the weapons he has at his disposal to destroy whole neighborhoods in Aleppo. Explosive containers are raining down on the city in a vicious way."
- Although apprehensive about Western nations in general, the population is greatly tempted to just leave the city and the country at all costs, even if they lose everything in the process.

- The news from week-to-week and month-to-month can sound repetitiously the same. Nevertheless, circumstances are becoming increasingly difficult for those living there.
- Our brothers and sisters continue to be very cautious about speaking openly on the phone or what they write in emails. Their lives can be endangered if they say the wrong thing. When contacting them, we are very discreet and do not pressure them for "news."
- The subject of Christian outreach can be easily misunderstood and taken the wrong way and actually a taboo subject when spoken about in public.
- Since the beginning of the crisis, the country has lost a total of 202 billion US Dollars.

#### **Dog days of Summer**

Have you been feeling edgy of late? Are you exhausted from the relentless summer heat? Spread too thin? Have your canine friends been acting peculiarly? We have been feeling it, not only at home but also in the office. The Dog Days are

surely upon us. If you are not familiar with the history of the phrase, Wikipedia states that in ancient Rome "Dog Days" was the time from July 24-August 24. Many European countries still adhere to this date. Dog Days was even mentioned in the Book of Common Prayer, 1552, although they dated them a little earlier as July 6-August 17. There is no reference to Dog Days in the 1662 Book of Common Prayer or later.

Traditionally, Dog Days coincided with the rising of the star Sirius, also known as the Dog Star, the brightest in the night sky and the most prominent star in the constellation Canis Major. These hottest days of the year were known to be a time when "the sea boiled, the wine turned sour, dogs grew mad, and all other creatures became languid; causing to man, among other diseases, burning fevers, hysterics, and phrensies (Clavis Calendaria, 1813).

We are reminded in the Holy Scriptures not to lose our cool even during Dog Days when we feel exhausted, the A/C is on the fritz, our kids (or the neighbor kids) are driving us crazy, or we find ourselves with unanticipated medical issues (and the bills that come with them) but instead, "in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6b-7

Friends, the Dog Days may be throwing you for a loop, and if they are, come and lay your burdens before the Lord Jesus Christ. He will not abandon us. He loves us and wants His very best for each one of us. Let us look to Him for help and, in faith, believe that in Him all things are possible and that He will give us the strength to make it through each day and every situation.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

Below is a summary financial statement of the Church's operations for the second quarter of 2015 compared to the annual budget for 2015. The financial success of 2015 to date is due to two principal factors: the continued generosity of our parishioners and management control over expenses. The combination of these two factors enabled St. John's to post a positive operating result of \$93,102.

As we head into the summer months, our expenses run as per usual, but revenues decrease sharply with the departure of our northern-based parishioners. We encourage everyone to keep their pledges current so that we do not have to dip into our investments to support operations.
