The Nominating Committee is pleased to announce three candidates for the 2016 Vestry: Ruth Adams, Vickie Bauch, and John Gualdoni.


The three will stand for election at the Annual Congregational Meeting to be held Monday, January 25, from 6 to 8 p.m. in Sugden Hall.

On the first Sunday of each month, the children begin with the adults in worship and are invited forward for the Children's sermon, after which they are excused to have a follow-up teaching and activity in Sugden Hall. The children return at the Peace for the remainder of the service.

The Holy Spirit had filled my room and I felt myself suddenly relax. What an awesome experience!

Christian, the blessed prayer shawl that became my save cocoon, and the continued prayers of all of you have been such gifts from the heart! The learned advice from my CCBB sisters, my time for quiet reflection and thanksgiving, your outpouring of cards, beautiful bouquets of flowers, phone calls, texts and e-mails and continuing meals have been blessings of such magnitude that "thank you" could be said a million times and still be inadequate! You all have been there each step of the way and Gary and I are so very grateful!

Simply said, you are loved and we are blessed to call you "family!"

Spirit Alive announces activity plans for 2016

Spirit Alive has planned another full season of activities. The first of these will be our annual field trip, which will take place on January 28. This time it will be to Naples Historic Palm Cottage and include a walk out the newly-refurbished Naples Pier before lunching together.

Under the preservation of the Naples Historical Society, the Palm Cottage House Museum will let us experience the rustic, hand-crafted charm of Old Naples through a guided tour. Trained docents will share unique insights, historic facts and colorful tales about this local architectural gem and the community surrounding it.

The oldest house in Naples (built in 1895) is constructed of tabby mortar, a hand-made concrete consisting of sand, shells and water. This two-story home was built by one of Naples founding residents, Walter N. Haldeman, and boasts 3,500 square feet of original and donated artwork, furnishings and tools spanning over 100 years.

The Palm Cottage admission is \$10 per person. The lunch details have not been completed at this time, but they will be available in January. We have enjoyed sharing together over lunch after our Spirit Alive visits.

We praise the Lord for gathering us together to build relationships at St. John's. We pray you will join us this year so we can get to know each other and Jesus better, and celebrate our rich lives here in Naples. \square
