

**Ash Wednesday Services** will be offered on Wednesday, February 10, at 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. May we begin a Holy Lent together!



The Book of Common Prayer tells us that Easter day is always the first Sunday after the full moon that falls on or after March 21. The moon experts tell us that there will be a full moon on March 23; therefore, Easter 2016 is on March 27.

The date of Easter determines the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, forty days before Easter, excluding Sundays (Sundays are feast days and are not counted in the forty days of the traditional Lenten fast. Some people choose to break their fast on Sundays).

Epiphany ends with Shrove Tuesday when we use up the sugar, fat and other foods in our kitchens that we might be fasting from during the coming season of Lent, hence church pancake suppers are synonymous with Shrove Tuesday.

On the tenth of this month, the church gathers in penitence, prayer and fasting for Ash Wednesday, a major fast day of the Church. In Ash Wednesday's liturgy, we are invited to "the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination, and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." (BCP pg. 265)

This year we are doubly urged by our Rector and the leadership of St. John's to truly commit ourselves to prayer, worship, fasting and service, intentionally setting aside "40 days 4 Him", coming together with other Christian individuals and

churches seeking the Lord's favor, leading and revival in SWFL, the nation, and the world.

Observing a Holy Lent can be so much more than simply doing (or not doing) this and that. The challenge is getting to the WHY — why am I doing this, that and the other? Whether it's giving up any number of things or adding to our daily routine (reading a chapter of the Bible each day, getting up a half-hour earlier in the morning to pray), our challenge is to get out of the sheer habit of doing what we have always done and, instead, to focus on being who we are called to be, by virtue of our baptism and trust in Jesus, making strides to truly be people of worship, prayer, fasting and service. The observance of a Holy Lent is less about rote doing and more about intentional being.

Brothers and sisters, during this season of Lent, I encourage us to take time to just <u>be</u> a little more than we have been of late — <u>being</u> with our Lord and Savior in <u>prayer</u>, <u>worship</u>, <u>fasting</u> and <u>service</u>. Talking a little perhaps, but listening and acting upon His good and perfect will even more —not because we must, but rather because we can and because we may —because of what the Lord has done for us! \$\frac{1}{2}\$





An Episcopal priest, he has lived and served in urban and rural California; suburban St. Louis; New York City; Dallas, Texas; and Paris, France. He was rector of the Church of Epiphany in


Of his seven previously published books, one is academic. The other six are novels about our turbulent times in regard to terrorism and human trafficking.
