

On April 28, 2016, I will be celebrating my 72nd birthday. According to the National Canons of the Episcopal Church, as well as the Canons of the Diocese of Southwest Florida, all persons in ministry of this age must resign from all duties in the church. From that point on, it is at the discretion of the Bishop that one serve in any ministerial capacity. Accordingly, I have recently had a meeting with the diocesan leadership to discuss my future ministry.

My passion in ministry since I was ordained has always been to serve the elderly and sick. I feel blessed that I am presently working for my 6th year as a chaplain for Avow Hospice in Naples. This ministry has brought me much satisfaction, and I continue to feel that this has been one of my strongest callings in my 13 years of ordained ministry. It is my intention to continue serving hospice on a limited basis as a chaplain.

As a result of much prayer and discernment, both with my family and my spiritual advisor, I have requested that the bishop not reassign me to parish ministry, and to allow me to devote my remaining time and energy to limited hospice work. This assignment will facilitate my being able to continue traveling to the Midwest to help my brother's family following his recent death.

Cheri and I have been blessed with wonderful friendships at St. John's, and will continue to pray for the parish family as you serve both our community and the world in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

St. John's Adopts New **Endowment Policy**

On April 26, the Vestry approved a new policy which restructures existing endowments by category rather than by donor name. At the same time, however, the donor's name is retained in order to memorialize their generosity. The purpose of the restructuring is to give direction to future donors of the needs of St. John's.

It is important to note that gifts to St. John's that are specified for endowments are held in perpetuity and only the future earnings of these gifts are used in support of the designated purpose. For example, if a \$50,000 gift is made in support of Outreach, the \$50,000 gift (corpus) may never be touched, but its investment earnings can be used to support outreach efforts. A methodology is in place to protect, as best as possible, the corpus from stock market fluctuations.

Currently, there are three endowments which have been funded: Outreach, Property and Clergy Support. Three new ones. which have yet to be funded, are: Music, Youth and Operations. The new categories go deeper than their names imply:

Outreach: The funding of local, national and international charities in need of additional support. Recent examples of the use of outreach funds are St. John's support of Christians in Allepo, Syria, gifts to our missionaries, Ned and Skye and Bishop Grant and Wendy, as well as adding funds to the St. John's benevolence fund to assist parishioners who face paralyzing financial needs.

Property: The purpose of this fund is to preserve, renovate and maintain our beautiful campus.

As we move thru May at St. John's, we continue to seek and receive the power of the Holy Spirit!


We have taken great joy in our Sunday School children and their pool party last week.





<u>Clergy Support:</u> To provide funds to our clergy for education and sabbaticals, as well as provide financial assistance to seminarians.

Music: Our music is a true gift to St. John's. However, funds to hire additional professional singers, develop a children's choir and otherwise enhance our music program are lacking. While this endowment has no current balance, promoting it may lead donors to direct their gifts to this area.

Youth: We need funds to help in the development and maturation of programs for children and youth at a time when our young people in this country are led away from Christcentered educational programs and activities.

Operations: Often donors want to leave the use of their funds up to the Clergy and Vestry. This endowment offers them an opportunity to make gifts for general use to support day-to-day operations.

St. John's Lenten Series 2016 was a special time of food, fellowship and hearing one another's stories.

Four people were videoed sharing their life journey and the spiritual experiences they had. It was fun to get to know them more, as well as people who participated in the small group discussions. During the 3rd week we welcomed college students who are part of CCO (Coalition for Christian Outreach), a Christian organization reaching out to college students. After sharing dinner, they participated in different small groups and shared about their outreach experience in Immokalee and Naples.

Becky shared that night, a powerful story of God's love, life struggles and healing. She testified that God used prayer and the Holy Spirit to save her life and how the special gift of a St. John's prayer shawl continues to bless her.

As we approached the end of our night, I had the St. John's family encircle the CCO students and we prayed for them, asking God to continue to bless and keep them. Then I placed a prayer shawl on one of their members as we asked God's love to enfold them.

CCO students have shared the following about that evening: "As soon as I entered St. John's I felt a rush of love wash over me." "Everyone was so friendly and just wanted to get to know me and my story." "As they prayed for us, it brought me to tears having them love on us and appreciating what we're doing in the community." "As they were praying, I was brought to tears. It was such a powerful night and I could feel all the love they had for us who they just met. I had a feeling as they prayed over us I cannot explain. We share the prayer shawl with those on campus at Ball State and then send it on to our friends at Edinboro." "For the first time I experienced a real Christian Community." \$\forall \text{Tommunity}."
