Four-session study begins Wednesday, March 4 at 6 p.m.

St. John's Lenten Series will be held for four consecutive Wednesday evenings and will begin with soup and bread in Sugden Hall.

This will be a four-session video study of *Epic: The Story God is Telling* by Master Story Teller John Eldredge with small group discussions.

One on-line review describes Epic as follows: "Life, for most of us, feels like a movie we've arrived to forty minutes late. Sure, good things happen, sometimes beautiful things. But tragic things happen, too. What does it mean? We find ourselves in the middle of a story that is sometimes wonderful, sometimes awful, usually a confusing mixture of both, and we haven't a clue how to make sense of it all. No wonder we keep losing heart. We need to know the rest of the story. For when we were born, we were born into the midst of a great story begun before the dawn of time. A story of adventure, of risk and loss, heroism, ... and betrayal. A story where good is warring against evil, danger lurks around every corner, and glorious deeds wait to be done. Think of all those stories you've ever loved--there's a reason they stirred your heart. They've been trying to tell you about the true Epic ever since you were young. There is a Larger Story. And you have a crucial role to play."

Winter Residents: All persons who spend a portion of the year in Naples, and who attend St. John's regularly, but don't wish to be considered full members.

At Home: Those persons confined to home or nursing home due to age or health, but wish to receive communion, pastoral care visits and be part of the St. John's family.

Email Only: Those who wish to receive our email updates.

Frankie Straw — 100 years young

Frances "Frankie" McCraney Straw, born March 12, 1915, describes her life in a brief phrase: "Hatched, matched, not quite dispatched."

This energetic, healthy, bright lady was born in a jail house! Her grandfather served as Sheriff of Bradford County in north central Pennsylvania. The two-story building, in Towanda, had an apartment in which the family lived. She was an only child.

Frankie graduated from Syracuse University with a degree in art but, with the advent of WWII, she joined the WAVES (Women Accepted for Voluntary Emergency Service), a division of the U.S. Navy (est. 1942) and, during her service, attained the rank of Lieutenant.

One of her assignments was with Naval Security in Washington, DC where she met Lt. Byron Straw, a 6'3" officer serving in the same branch.


They married in March 1950 and, following the war, continued to serve their country in the Armed Forces Security Agency (AFSA) office at Arlington, VA (later to become NSA).

Retiring in 1970, they found Naples and built a home on Bow Line Drive in the Moorings. They also discovered St. John's Church which, at the time, was completing construction of the Sanctuary building and meeting in temporary locations. When Byron died in 1989, Frankie became the first occupant of the Colonade, directly behind St. John's, and still resides there. She was very active in our Altar Guild for many years and used to maintain the garden that surrounded the church's sign at the corner.

Blessings, Frankie, from your Parish Family. We love you! \square

Below is a summary financial statement of the Church's operations for 2014, which are subject to audit, compared to the budget for 2015. The financial success of 2014 is due to two principal factors: the continued generosity of our parishioners and management control over expenses. The combination of these two factors enabled St. John's to post a positive operating result of \$123,229, which will go a long way to restore the re-



serves consumed by the Restoration Project.

Great new site and space

Our new site, Units 19-20 of Tamiami Square Shopping Center, 14700 Tamiami Trail, N. is just two miles north of Immokalee Rd. on Rt. 41. It will carry us well into the future with all new technology, credit card usage, a much-needed washer and dryer and a comfortable, clean work space. There are ample parking spaces and, a bright, spacious, colorful atmosphere for shopping or visiting.

If inspections are passed, current plans are to move from our present location on March 8th, 9th, and 10th with an opening no later than Monday, March 16th.
