A vision and a welcoming place for St. John's youth


Mark tells us in the tenth chapter of his gospel account, "People were bringing little children to him [Jesus] in order that he might touch

A Foyer Group has a place waiting for you

Whether you're new to St. John's or a long-standing member, one of the best ways to get to know others in your church is through Foyer Groups.

Definition: Foyer is a French word meaning "hearthside" implying the warmth of a close, small group of friends sharing a common love and concern for each other.

History: After the World War II bombing of Coventry Cathedral, small groups of people began meeting to rebuild their community with a short litany, a modest meal, and conversation. In time, Groups began springing up in parishes all over Britain and America.

What are today's Foyer Groups? Foyer Groups are a fun and easy way for parishioners to gather together on a regular but informal basis for purely social reasons – to enjoy one another's company, to strengthen bonds of community, to meet new members and just to get to know other people who share a common interest in St. John's. There is no agenda or plan – just casual fellowship and a refreshing meal. Groups are made up of singles, couples, young people, retired folks, etc., in other words, a cross-section of the congregation. Out of the meetings, friendships develop among people who might not have any other opportunity to meet and get to know each other. Newcomers are especially invited to join one of the groups.

How long do they stay together? Each small group of eight to ten people meets three times, beginning in January and continuing



through May, in the home of one of the members of the group. Each group selects a date and time that are convenient for all members.

Do I have to host a fancy dinner if we meet at my house? Absolutely not! The host should email or call all members during the week before a get-together to remind them of the date and time and confirm the menu items attendees are bringing. The host provides the main course, while the other members fill in the rest of the meal such as appetizer, bread, salad, veggies, and dessert. Some groups have enjoyed gathering for a picnic lunch or meeting at a local restaurant. The main idea is for the gatherings to focus on Christian fellowship, to share a simple meal and have relaxed conversation.

Are Foyer Groups for adults only? At present, Foyer is for adult groups only.

How do I get involved? Simply call the church office or sign up on the clipboards that have been circulating during services. You will be randomly grouped with three or four other singles and/or couples. We will let you know who your group leader is. The group leader will be in charge of keeping the calendar and reminding everyone of who is hosting the Foyer Group each month. Sign up now! You'll be glad you did!

Wanted: Willing Hands and Hearts


