Some seventy parishes were present and it is quite an experience to be sitting with so many clergy and lay persons celebrating their service to the Lord.

Since my last article, there is continued work on St. John's website, both in terms of content and speed. Barbara Johnson is looking to integrate our web offerings in Sugden Hall with Youth Sunday School. I also want to introduce a new type of Church Directory for St. John's, one that will be printable, available online and always current.

Instant Church Directory is an online service that will enable us to offer the following:

- A St. John's Directory that can be viewed on any computer or mobile device and it will be password protected. Apple, Android and Kindle **Instant Church Directory** Apps can be downloaded to your device. Once downloaded, you'll be asked for your email address as it's listed in our current directory. Once you enter the email address, you will receive a password. Entering the password starts the directory download to your device, and once completed, you can search for members and call, email and text right from the app.
- Please send your email address to Ann at <u>parishsecretary@stjohnsnaples.com</u> if we don't have it. Also, more information about ICD can be found at www.instantchurch directory.com.
- Online activity needs to be secure. There will be an administrator overseeing the directory, submissions and keeping member lists current.

- Only those who have matching emails can access the directory via their app or on our website via a password secured from the administrator.
- We encourage you to allow your picture to be part of the Instant Church Directory. We only need head shots, or a small group picture, that can be emailed by you to Ann, or taken after St. John's worships services at a time to be announced. It is understood that when you submit a picture to us, you are giving us permission to post it on the online directory.

St. John's Instant Church Directory project has already begun and will go through April 2015. Printed Directories will be available after April 2015 by contacting Ann at 239.261.2355. This Directory will be continually updated and current. \$\P\$

Our lessons this fall will focus on building our trust in God. We will be learning that God listens to us, speaks to us, and we can speak to God through prayer.


