





St. John's members invited a number of guests and we went through some tissue as we watched this moving story. We all left inspired by God's great love for us and the gift of Heaven!







Greetings from Mission Camp at Dayspring Camp and Conference Center where we are hot, sweaty and bug-eaten, but also filled with the joy of the Holy Spirit as we learn more about God, meet others and serve the world around us. On July 23, two of our Jr/Sr High youth and I embarked on a weeklong journey, not only to Diocesan Camp, but also on mission, taking the love of Christ out to those around us. This is the last week of

summer camp for our Southwest Florida Diocese and they decided to go out with a bang, bringing together 48 students plus counselors, junior counselors and adults from around the diocese to serve at three different local outreach ministries: Redlands Christian Migrant Association (RCMA (Wimauma)), All Faiths Food Bank (Sarasota), and Turning Points Homeless Assistance (Bradenton).

Our week of camp consists of three days serving at one of the ministry sites, and just to make sure participants get their whole camp experience, we will be spending a fun day at camp on Thursday, just enjoying all that Dayspring has to offer: hanging at the new pool, canoeing on the river, doing some relaxing arts and crafts and singing around the campfire. For our first three days, Paul Rober and I went to the RCMA in Wimauma where our group of 20 read to children, played games, sung songs, held babies and simply loved on the kids who come each and everyday to this place while their parents are working in the near-by fields. After lunch, we wrapped things up at RCMA by participating in some heavy labor- painting, planting and pulling weeds- before heading back to camp. Heleana Bentley and a group of 15 others went to the food bank in Sarasota. There they toured the facility, organized hundreds of pounds of food and packaged over 2000 bags of food which are sent home with kids each Friday at a number of weekday care centers, like the YMCA, to ensure that they have some weekend 'snacks' to carry them through till retuning to care on Monday.





DaySpring Camp and Conference Center in Parrish, FL, is the Diocesan center of SWFL diocese and the camp has been providing a safe, spiritual, uplifting and fun environment for kids of all ages to attend since the 1980's. Over the last couple of years, many of our Jr and Sr High students have made their way up north in order to grow in their faith through the unique camp experience, which the Diocese of SWFL and Dayspring offer. Emmanuel Community in Aleppo, June Update June 21, 2017

The brethren from Emmanuel Community in Aleppo Syria just finished a long-awaited retreat in the first week of June where they came upon a renewed commitment to the vision and mission they have from the Lord. There are about 60 people in the core community. Earlier this month an additional 19 made their commitment to join this core group.

Fortunately, I only have good news to report. Even if not much has changed concerning the prohibitive commodity prices. The community operates with the support of local clergy, both priests and bishop. There is also a parish Priest who has joined as a member and is helping with the pastoral care of the community. The new center is located in a safe area – particularly important so that either at night or during the day the members (specially the sisters) can get there to attend small group meetings, formation courses and evangelistic prayer events.

The property is a 5 bedroom flat that will be converted to serve as a community center. Current work includes purchasing office furniture and group session chairs, upgrading toilets, revamping the kitchen to serve large group events, enhancing security of the building, and putting in air conditioning which is currently not there. This type of conversion is quite typical in Aleppo, and following the devastation of the war very much needed.

This process will realistically take many months to achieve. Please note that most of the skilled labor has left the city and those who have remained are swamped with work and they have to work slowly by hand. Why? Because many machines have been destroyed by the fighting that went on for the last five years in two thirds of the city.

Churches are now operating in the area where the apartment is as it is in the heart of where the Christian population exists. Prices for good real estate continue to be highly prohibitive for the local population.

The Emmanuel Community is running their regular schedule of evangelism and formation courses as the renovation of the center is slowly getting under way. They have even more people participating since the cessation of fighting last December. There are about 120 people who have lately attended their prayer meetings. The feast of Pentecost was celebrated with a week end retreat where rich worship, and strong community relationships were evident.

The Community sends their special thanks to St. John's Episcopal Church for partnering with them in the establishment of this community center in Aleppo. This is a seed of hope planted amidst the devastation from the war. It is serving as both a lifeline for many in need as well as a place of renewal for the Christian church in Aleppo. May the Holy Spirit fulfil his purposes in and through each us as we share in this ministry.

We are blessed to have a new altar guild member, Pat Korda. She brings experience, a desire to serve the church community, and a deep love of our Lord.




Treasurer's Report



The SHELTER FOR ABUSED WOMEN & CHILDREN

On Sunday (12/11/16), fourteen charities were the recipients of a total of \$160,000 from St. John's Outreach Ministry. Today we would like to highlight one of those special charities, the Shelter for Abused Women & Children.

The Shelter for Abused Women & Children (The Shelter) administers a 60-bed emergency shelter for victims of domestic violence and victims of human trafficking, which operates 24 hours per day, 365 days per year. In addition to its emergency shelter, The Shelter provides outreach services and transitional housing. The Shelter has vital services in place to assist survivors in becoming independent and self-sufficient including:

The Shelter's 60-bed emergency shelter is located in Naples, Florida and serves Collier County. Over the years, the organization has grown from an all-volunteer program to a well-respected comprehensive program serving over 2,200 adult and child victims of domestic violence and human trafficking through its residential and outreach programs and over 17,000 through its Community Education & Prevention programs annually.
