


Having just celebrated Memorial Day, I'm struck by the reality of remembering another's life in the midst of their death, and what that means for us who still walk this earth. This special day invites us to embrace a kaleidoscope of life snapshots, moments that still stir some of the deepest parts of us, and connect us to a world both seen and unseen.

One life I've recently remembered is Ray Multer, someone I came to know through Davia. Both Ray and Davia were St. John's members, lived at Heritage Nursing Home, were confined to wheel chairs and faced numerous health issues. They also were full of life and the Spirit, optimistic and faithful, encouraging one another and others on life's journey. Davia went home to be with our Lord a number of years ago, and as Ray and I planned out his burial service, he stated he wanted to be scattered by Davia in the Garden of the Resurrection. What a wonderful testament to their friendship!

Ray, the New Yorker with 10 lives, fought numerous health challenges and was stronger for it. He recently passed on to be with our Lord and I'll always remember my last day with Ray. Mary Jane, Don, Becky, Lisa and myself made numerous visits to Ray over his last days. The last time I saw him was a Friday afternoon, after I completed the Golfathon and freshened up. After connecting briefly with Mary Jane, Don and his hospice nurse, they left me alone with him. I noticed he was breathing heavy and I sensed he was fighting death. This is normal, but I also began to pray with Ray for peace and surrender to our Lord in that moment. I walked around his room, interceding and worshipping, inviting more deeply the Holy Spirit's presence, angels and God's loving grace into our space.

After 10 minutes, I felt a change in the room's spiritual atmosphere and Ray's breathing was slower and calmer. Unconscious the entire time, his body and spirit were being touched by the Holy Spirit and prepared for the journey to heaven.

May God return your sacrifice to St. John's beyond measure."



# St. John's Receives \$100,000 General Endowment Gift

The trustee of the estate of Henry E. Haegg, a long-time member of St. John's who recently passed away, announced a gift of \$100,000 to endow a "General Endowment Fund". The \$100,000 is "permanently" restricted and may not ever be invaded. Only the future earnings from the investment of the funds may be used by the Vestry for general operating purposes.

Today, we now have the following endowment funds:

The earnings from the investment of any permanently restricted fund is referred to as "temporary restricted". These earnings may only be used for the purpose designated by the original gift. As an example, this year we disbursed approximately \$40,000 from the temporary funds of the Outreach Endowment Fund to support a Christian center in Aleppo, our missionaries in Turkey (Ned and Skye) and to support "Food for the Poor", all perfect examples of the meaning of outreach.

The majority of the funds in the Outreach, Clergy Support and Property funds come from legacy donors, some dating back to the early 1990's. The Youth and Music Endowment funds were created within the past year. They are in sore need of greater funding. The General fund was created as a result of the bequest from Mr. Haegg.

Is St. John's in your will? Or, are you planning to create any kind of gift to St. John's in the future? If you do, please contact us so that we can assist you in directing the gift to an endowment fund that fits the needs of St. John's, while giving you the peace of mind that it will be used only for the purposes you desire, e.g. outreach or music.

We can provide you and your family with the necessary documentation that acknowledges your gift, designates its use and gives you the assurances that it will only be used for that purpose. It is important that we mutually document the gift so that there is no uncertainty as to how it will be used in the future.

The joy of giving to the work of our Lord is truly special. Leaving a permanent legacy in your name means the Lord's work through St. John's will continue for years to come. It truly is the gift that keeps on giving.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have been abundantly blessed since we were given the vision to create Christian Healing Center of Naples, Inc. With every step, God has led us in ways that have been clear, precise, and fun! And God is fulfilling on every promise found in scripture regarding healing.

Since opening in November 2016, with the crucial support of St. John's, many people have come for healing prayer. One person with cancer came having been told by the doctor there was no hope. After prayer, the malignant tumor shrunk in size and the doctor readmitted the person into the cancer treatment program with hope. Other people have been freed from pain and emotional trauma through prayer. God is moving and we believe He is using healing and deliverance to bring people to believe in Him through the healing power of Jesus Christ.

And now by the grace of God, Rev. Dan Pinckney, with his wife lara, have joined CHC as Spiritual Director. Dan and lara have been missionaries, planting churches in South America and Europe. He has also served in large churches here in the United States. His ministry spans three decades and as he was concluding an assignment at Covenant Church in Naples, he accepted our call to serve God with us; teaching, healing and delivering people-all of which Dan and lara are passionate to do.

As word circulated that Dan might join us, two gifts were received as faith gifts restricted for his support. One totaling \$5,000 was given anonymously with the challenge that other people might match or exceed this gift amount. In the two weeks that Dan has been with us, he has spoken to two men's groups about CHC, Covenant Church and St. John's Episcopal Church, and he led prayer teams at the Revive All concert in Cambier Park where 300 people attended and 20 churches were represented. He also presented to the area-wide Presbytery meeting where pastors and leaders of approximately fourteen churches were introduced to CHC. And more donations have been received.

This letter is meant to bring you up to date on all that is transpiring at CHC, and it is an invitation for you to participate in the healings and miracles God is doing through CHC with your gift of treasure. While active in parish life at St. John's for many years, I only recently became involved with the healing prayer ministry of the Order of St. Luke.

"It's a good fit," I thought. After all, I regularly interceded for my clients when I counseled, for my students when I taught, and for my family, friends and many others. I soon discovered that I had a lot to learn.

Anyone wishing to join OSL participates in a three-prong training experience in a group led by experienced teachers. The first phase is a re-examination of the healing ministry of Jesus himself. The second is a re-examination of yourself and your need for healing. The third is an ongoing practicum, working in teams, applying what you've learned, and praying for others. For me, each step brought a special blessing.

Studying Christ's healing miracles meant witnessing anew the weight of his compassion, the depth of his humility and the power of his loving kindness. Who could resist such a friend? Ironically, we not only can resist, but to our own painful detriment, we all too often do. I did.

Entering the second phase of OSL training, I thought I knew myself pretty well, but at a weekend healing seminar with Craig Miller, when prompted to ask for prayer, I resisted.

During the past decade, my life progressively narrowed because of pain that resulted from two physical traumas: one that crushed the bones in my feet and another that herniated the discs in my back, increasingly diminishing the length of one of my legs. Despite orthotics, surgery and other costly treatments, pain made walking a challenge and sleep elusive. Prompted again to ask for prayer when Craig Miller came to our OSL meeting on Ash Wednesday, I humbled myself and asked.

My loving OSL family gathered around, lay on their hands and prayed. That night I slept without pain, and I have not had pain since. I asked my podiatrist to measure my legs. They are of equal length. She x-rayed my feet. The bones are still gnarled, but since I am pain free, for the first time in decades, I have no restrictions on walking or footwear. In celebration of my healing, I bought some sandals, had a pedicure and went dancing! That was only the beginning.

Gently, God revealed his desire to deeply heal me from a much more painful and far-reaching trauma. Buoyant from my physical healing, I did not resist. Through the prayer of faithful intercessors, God healed me and continues to heal me, setting me free to *truly* live the abundant life he prepared for me. The second prong of OSL training propelled me with supernatural force into the third.

When God heals not only your body, but also your broken heart, when he sets you free and releases you from darkness, when he anoints you with joy and clothes you with praise, like the masses in Galilee, you want to bring everyone to Jesus. Come and see how good God is. Let us pray for you.


On Sunday (12/11/16), fourteen charities were the recipients of a total of \$160,000 from St. John's Outreach Ministry. Today we would like to highlight one of those special charities, Habitat for Humanity of Collier County.

Habitat for Humanity of Collier County is a servant of the church, operating on Christian principles that seek to put God's love into action by building homes, communities and hope.

For nearly 40 years, Habitat Collier has been partnering with hard-working, low-income families to solve the affordable housing problem, with the vision of a world where everyone has a simple, decent place to live. Habitat is now the main provider of owner-occupied affordable housing in the county but the need has reached the point of crisis. This past year, eighteen families inquired for every home built in 2013. Those saddled with high housing costs and low wages are some of Collier County's most critical workers – those who teach our children, care for the sick and infirm and sell everyday necessities to residents and tourists alike. After more than a decade of building on average 100 homes per year, the goal this year is to build 120 given the tremendous need.

Habitat SELLS homes to hard-working families who complete an exhaustive application process and qualify to buy a home with an interest-free mortgage. Approved applicants coplete 500 hours of "sweat equity" building their home and the homes of their future neighbors. Partner families attend classes in budgeting, home maintenance, family support and owning in a community. Each family makes a \$1,000 down payment and pays their first year's insurance upfront. More than 300 families have paid off their mortgages and own their homes free and clear.

Habitat Collier has been serving families since 1978. To date more than 1900 families and 4500 children have attained strength, stability and self-reliance by purchasing safe and decent homes thanks to the generosity of people such as you. Half of our homes are in Naples, half in Immokalee. Building started in Naples in 1993 and in Immokalee in 1978. Today we are building in Legacy Lakes, our first community in North Naples, and in Faith Landing in Immokalee.
