

Guyana Mission

Sue Boujoukos, Mike Johnson and I traveled to Guyana March 6-13 to bring healing and revival to this South American nation. We traveled with Global Awakening, an International mission group founded by Randy Clark, that has done 100's of similar missions worldwide with tremendous spiritual impact. Our Guyana team of approximately 30 people was small compared to usual numbers, but I was impressed by the spiritual maturity and boldness of our ministry team.

Our first and last days were for travel encompassing 14 hours in cars, planes and exciting Guyana taxi rides. We had 6 ministry days, 3 with the Full Gospel International Conference (Our Host Church) and 3 Crusade days. Our usual day began with 6am prep, 7am breakfast, 830am bus ride to morning Conference session (Worship, Message, Healing Prayer); 1pm lunch, 2-4pm Team session, 5pm dinner, 630pm bus ride to evening Conference session (Worship, Message, Healing Prayer). We arrived back at the hotel around 1030 pm and ready for bed. There was some schedule flexibility, including a tour day and occasional afternoon breaks, but there was much ministry and learning happening.

My Key Lessons:

Spiritual Vitality includes Church Worship, Inspiring Biblical Messages, Heartfelt Prayers for others, the Holy Spirit's Presence, Passionate people in ministry lifting up Jesus Christ to the World!

Some Healed & All Loved was Global Awakening's ministry theme. The reality was some were healed, some weren't, but every person was loved, embraced and encouraged.

Be Open to Change as each day is an opportunity to learn something new and use it. I plan to increase use of "Words of Knowledge" (Revelation of what God is doing NOW) since miracles follow; "Exercise Faith" (Move that leg or arm to gage Healing); "Always Love Them" (God's love is the Heart of Healing).

Street Ministry: Be open to go to the streets, markets and neighborhoods, simply offering to pray!

Miracles and salvations came from this in Guyana and team members are doing this in the US already.

We plan to host an informational gathering about our Guyana Mission Trip, complete with videos, pictures and commentary. Stay tuned for details about this exciting event.

In closing, please keep the Guyanese Church and people in your prayers as Revival breaks out in their midst. This was an exciting start to a process God has been nurturing for years and we we're blessed to be part of it. I leave you with the following stats from our week in Guayana:

This month we are invited to embark on a journey along the path our Lord followed as we remember the week of His Passion, also known as Passion Week or Passiontide. Churches around the would will begin this week with Palm Sunday, when we wave palm branches in celebration and shed tears of sadness recalling the events of the week to come by reading the Passion narrative, which is then traditionally read again on Good Friday.

On Thursday (Maundy Thursday), most churches begin by recalling Jesus sending His disciples to make preparations for the Passover meal and sharing His last meal with them in the upper room. This is really the place where Jesus participated in His last activities where He called the shots. For after this meal, Jesus is handed over in the garden of Gethsemane and becomes the One to whom things are being done. He was arrested, He was led to the high priest under the cover of night, He was laughed at and beaten, He was led to the chief priests and teachers of the law, He was brought before Pilate, He was wrongfully accused, He was stripped and dressed in a royal robe, He was led to the place of The Skull, He was spit upon and mocked, He was hung and nailed to a tree and He was lifted high into the air, left for dead. All these things happened to our Lord and He chose to have no control.

Author Henri Nouwen has said that it is in the passion of our Lord Jesus Christ that new life becomes visible, because it is in the passion of our Lord that we see the love of God that does not seek control. It is in the passion of our Lord that we can see God's Love shine through the darkest of any circumstance. It is in the passion of our Lord that my life, your life, and every man, woman and child's life has been acted upon: past present and future. It is only as we come to grips with the passion of our Lord, wrestling at times with the truth of the Gospel and allowing God's Word to infiltrate our hearts, that we can come in touch with the new life that Jesus' passion offers each and every person. The practice of walking through Passiontide for Christians is a reminder that the key to knowing God's love and grace in our lives is not action, it is passion as we let the love, the grace and the Spirit of God move our hearts and imprint on our very souls-leading, guiding and reordering our lives each and every day.

I encourage you as followers of Christ to attend the traditional Holy Week services walking alongside our Lord and Savior as He is celebrated as King coming into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, washes His disciples feet and institutes the last supper on Maundy Thursday, walks the way of the cross on Good Friday and is resurrected on Easter Sunday! Make the most of this Holy Week by taking time to worship our Lord, celebrating the marvelous things He has done, remembering with sober judgment that it is only through the shedding of His blood as the pure, spotless Lamb that we are brought into a right relationship with God.

had the privilege of traveling with Fr. Joe and Mike Johnson there and spent a week in this Country which is located northeast of Brazil. When approached about traveling with Global Awakening as a team member, it was the farthest thing from my mind. Let me just say that whatever traveling I have done with my husband, it was always done in "safe places" where we would be "comfortable". Guyana was so far removed from my comfort zone that I had no choice but to turn to God and pray into my journey. Guess what! St. John's Shoppe



On Sunday (12/11/16), fourteen charities were the recipients of a total of \$160,000 from St. John's Outreach Ministry. Today we would like to highlight one of those special charities, Charity for Change Giver Program.

Since 2008, Charity for Change has engaged more than 20,000 pre-K through 5th grade children in developing character, volunteering and giving habits through our academic Giver Program.

Research shows that teaching children social and emotional skills has longrange benefits affecting children's success in school, careers and life. Practicing behaviors such as cooperation, respect, empathy and compassion replace negative behaviors such as violence, disrespect, apathy and under achievement.

In 2016, thanks to the generosity of St. John's Episcopal Church outreach ministry, the Giver Program expanded to summer school to address the learning gap for at-risk children. Preliminary study results show children actually made gains in math and improved character. This is a significant result for children who typically lose up to 9 weeks of instruction over the summer. The Giver Program also continues to serve children through the afterschool and in-school programs.

Children from all socioeconomic backgrounds learn that by taking action for the benefit of others through charity, they can be contributing members of their community. While completing academic activities, children participating in the Giver Program have raised more than \$115,000 for 72 charities and have benefited from 900 classroom visits from their charity representatives.

We are grateful to St. John's Episcopal Church for investing in our children, empowering them to achieve their full potential as successful, engaged members of our community.


