

Good News Club Launched!

Thursday afternoon, January 17, we launched our Good News Club at Gulf Coast Charter Elementary School! Thirty students, K through 5th grade, gathered to learn about Jesus: God who came to earth!

We began in **Small Groups** learning names, birth months, family celebrations. Our "UP WORD" for the day was "**GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES**." God promised to send a Savior and He did!

Our Lesson was Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, just as the prophet Micah had said would happen.

The angel Gabriel appeared to Mary in Nazareth and told her that the Holy Spirit would overshadow her and she would be blessed with a baby boy, to be named Jesus. Gabriel also appeared to Joseph, Mary's fiance, to say don't break off your engagement —go ahead and marry Mary. The couple then learned they had to travel some 70 miles from Nazareth to Bethlehem to pay their taxes in person. Bethlehem was Joseph's ancestral home, King David's city. **GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES!**

In Bethlehem, the only place they could find to stay was a lowly stable. That night Mary gave birth to Jesus, wrapped Him in strips of cloth and laid Him in a manger. People would understand that Jesus was everyone's Savior, regardless of whether they were rich or poor. **GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES!**

Our lesson continued with the angel(s) telling the shepherds the Good News and how to find the newborn Savior. After the shepherds found and worshipped the baby, they went out and told everyone they met Good News! Imagine them telling the story of what happened that night over and over again for the rest of their lives. **GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES!**

Each week, we learn a **memory verse**. That week our memory verse was Luke 2: 11, "For unto you is born this night in the city of David the Savior who is Christ the Lord!" We sang this verse with hand motions and gusto!

Back in small groups, we had what we call "Wonder Time." Each child shared something they knew about one of their friends. How did they learn about their friend? By spending time with them, of course. They will learn more about God by spending time with Him too. They brought to mind someone they know who doesn't know Jesus. They may not be angels, but they talked about how they could tell someone the Good News of the Savior who came to save us all.

The children went home with a Quiet Time Sheet, a copy of the memory verse, and a piece of candy!

What a sweet joy to share God's love with these kids in our Good News Club!

February 2019

Bible verse: "Forever, O Lord, your word is firmly fixed in the heavens. Your faithfulness endures to all generations; you have established the earth, and it stands fast." Psalm 119:89-90

Week 1: God's Word Guides Us

Key Passages: Psalm 119:105; Titus 1:2

Group A - Lesson Focus: God's word is always true. We can trust it to guide us because God is un-

changeable and cannot lie.

Group B - Objectives: To study God's Word by observing the text and asking questions: who, what,

when, where and why.

Week 2: God Preserves His Word

Key Passages: Jeremiah 36:22-23, 36:27-28

Group A – Lesson Focus: God always has and always will protect His Word. His Word will last forever.

Group B - Objectives: To understand that God's Word will endure forever through all generations.

Week 3: God's Word Is Complete Key Passages: Psalm 119:160, 119:89

Group A - Lesson Focus: All of God's Word is true. It is complete and will never change.

Group B – Objectives: The Bible – both Old and New Testament, is the complete written Word of God.

Week 4: Don't Change God's Word

Key Passages: Deuteronomy 4:2, Proverbs 30:6

Group A - Lesson Focus: The Bible is the infallible Word of God and is our final authority. God has

warned of serious punishment for those who presume to make changes to His Word.

Group B – Objectives: The Bible is the only inspired revelation from God. It must be the absolute authority. Many have tried and will continue to try to change God's Word and teach lies. We must be aware of

false teachers and false religions.

Grief Has Many Faces

Can a broken heart actually kill you? YES! Extreme stress can cause what is called "broken heart syndrome". The medical terminology is "takotsubo cardiomyopathy" which is essentially a sudden heart attack. And it actually happened to one of our own parishioners a short time ago after her husband passed!

Extreme grief comes from many sources. Even if we haven't experienced first-hand, we understand the formatted "steps" handed down long ago by Elizabeth Kubler Ross on death and dying. However, unfortunately grief has its own heartbeat and doesn't always follow the designated path she prescribes. And her references primarily refer to the loss of human loved ones.

However, there are other losses that can heavily impact our hearts. An unwanted divorce, loss of an occupation or job and the community that it surrounds, a debilitating health issue in which a person can no longer function in the way that they're accustomed, financial changes which seems so devastating that it can lead to suicide (as it did for a good friend of mine), being placed into a permanent care center living situation against one's wishes and certainly the loss of "man's best friend" a treasured pet that has been a part of family for years!

Those who are not pet lovers might not understand the depths of a relationship between humans and their pet. But when longevity bonds a person to their "fur baby", many ties are etched into that bond. Understood "Conversation", the expression of needs and wants when your pet curls up against you in times of sickness or sadness, dependability, understanding, needs, affection and caregiving are all as much a part of that relationship as it often is with another human beingsometimes perhaps even more when a person lives alone or is living in a compromised household!

"Just this side of heaven is a place called Rainbow Bridge" which is a very beautiful and well-known poem. Perhaps many in our St. John's church family haven't seen or perhaps don't know about our own Rainbow Bridge Garden on the northeast end of the church campus. This is a designated place on our grounds designed specifically for our own precious "fur family" members. It is a lovely landscaped area, adorned with St. Francis Assisi surrounded by animals and includes a bench for reflection and solitude!



Two years ago it was personally designed, installed and donated by Bob Matthews and Gary Jarrell. A granite plaque, with the Rainbow Bridge poem, was enthusiastically engraved by a company in Montana who personally embraced the concept. This little garden provides a beautiful, sacred and quiet resting place for our beloved "fur family" just as our Memorial Garden provides for our human beloved ones. If you have a "fur baby", please take a moment to experience and consider this area on St. John's campus as situations arise and this kind of loss becomes a reality in your life.


