



It was an experience that you cannot describe in words. The installation ceremony took place immediately after finishing the 26th miracle. This included each person being prayed for and receiving their OSL pin and healing balm. They are all ready "to go out into this tired and hurting world with strength and gladness, for there are deeds of courage and compassion that will not be done unless YOU do them and there are words of hope and healing that will not be done unless YOU do them".

From the Treasurer's Desk

Each year, a portion (10%) each Episcopal Church's revenues are paid to the Diocese to provide for their expenses over the course of the year. Of that amount, a fraction (15%) of the apportionment is paid, by the Diocese, to Episcopal Church USA, commonly referred to as ECUSA.

Through the years, a number of parishioners have designated, by a note on their contribution checks, that no portion of their gift should be included in the funds that are paid by the Diocese to ECUSA. Our Church and a few others in the Diocese of Southwest Florida have asked for and received a waiver, which provided that gifts designated as "Non-ECUSA," and included in the apportionment to the Diocese, would not be subject to further distributions to ECUSA.

In February, our Diocese was advised by ECUSA that the canons of the Church had been changed, and a waiver provided to the Diocese in the past would no longer be honored by ECUSA. Any Diocese that does not comply with this new provision "will not be eligible for grants, scholarships, loans, and other awards" provided by ECUSA.

We realize that the matter of the "Non-ECUSA" designation of the gifts of some of our parishioners is a personal matter and a matter of principal, which the Diocese has honored in the past. Understandably though, the Diocese does not want to risk the loss of benefits for non-compliance with the ECUSA canons.

To provide perspective, the portion of St. John's apportionment to the Diocese that would be paid to ECUSA last year would have been less than \$2,000. We pray that the change in canons by ECUSA will not influence or change the generosity of all of our St John's members and families in funding our needs during the course of the year.

Thank all of you for the help, and the sharing of love to accomplish what we did on March 23, 2019, and thank all of you that took time out of your busy schedule to


attend. The question is what are we going to do next year???

I have always known that God is with me, but one day

He showed up in a way that assured me of His tender love for me in a way as never before.

Late one March afternoon almost ten years ago, I was sitting alone in my family room with my back to the main part of the house. My mind was spinning with all the controversy that took place in my home on a daily basis. I felt alone and in despair. Nobody was in the house, but me. No television was on, not even a radio. "Why me?" I asked myself. Why had God so honored me? Instantly, deep within me I heard, "Why not you?"

I am God's beloved child whom He embraced with the mighty wind of His Holy Spirit. I felt then and I continue to feel so very blessed.





She and her husband, Frances MacNutt, have been in the healing ministry collectively for over 110 years! They started Christian Healing Ministries (CHM) in Jacksonville, Florida, over 40 years ago. Our Mission was attended by over 200 people from 20 different churches, with many different denominations being represented.

Judith spoke on a theme of LISTEN, LOVE, and PRAY, which is their theme for their CHM. She taught us to LISTEN to the people we are praying for and also to LISTEN to the Holy Spirit while we are praying. Judith spoke of how LOVE is most important and not to judge others as they share their story. She reminded us

that Jesus told us to "love one another, as I have loved you". She told us to PRAY for people as Jesus did, with the belief that they will be healed. Miracles did happen during the time of Christ and they are still happening today.

One of the most amazing things that happened on that Saturday was that after Judith finished her three talks on LISTEN, LOVE and PRAY she went back into Sugden Hall and prayed for everyone. 

Ned and Sky Derrickson - Turkey




